AHTD TO HOLD "30 CROSSING" PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT MEETING IN NORTH LITTLE ROCK

LITTLE ROCK (10-16) - The Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) will hold a public involvement meeting in North Little Rock to present and discuss plans to widen Interstate 30 in Little Rock and North Little Rock between Interstate 40 and Interstate 530, including the Arkansas River Bridge, as well as improvements to I-40 from IFK Boulevard to Highway 67. The 30 Crossing project is part of the department's Connecting Arkansas Program (CAP).

The public meeting will provide an update since the Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) study was completed and approved in July. During this time, the study team has further evaluated roadway, bridge and interchange concepts to widen I-30 to 10 lanes with a downtown collector/distributor system, as well as evaluated an additional alternative to widen I-30 to 8 lanes. Additional work has included initiating environmental evaluations required under the National Environmental Policy Act and identifying and analyzing ways to minimize impacts.

The meeting will be held Thursday, October 22, 2015, from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., at Friendly Chapel Church of the Nazarene (Gym), 116 South Pine Street in North Little Rock.

The meeting will be held in an open house format, and the public is invited to visit anytime during the scheduled hours to view displays, ask questions, and offer comments about the proposed project. 


I can honestly say that with the support and prayers of family I have survived. I come from a spiritual family on both sides and that was a blessing to know that they were in my corner. At 41 I was diagnosed with stage 2 breast cancer. I went for my annual mammogram as I've always done for years with no problems; the technician asked me if I had cysts in the past, which are fluid-filled sac within the breast. I have never had that before so that was a red flag. When your examine is complete, and they tell you to wait in the small room so the doctor can view your results that's a challenge within itself. But to say do you have cysts in your breast and say let's see what the doctors has to say,

I was worried and for good reason. I had three lumps in my right breast and after having a biopsy they each had cancer cells in them. Your first thought is "Am I going to die"? You rush to the internet and try to find out anything to comfort you, which I do not recommend, your doctor would be the one to answer all your questions concerning your health.

From that day I was overloaded with information, test, and scans. I had a wonderful From that day I was overloaded with information, test, and scans. I had a wonderful team. They told me everything that was going to happen and how it would happen. I was more of a test subject for the oncology team. I did not have a history of breast cancer, I did not smoke, I was not taking any medication and I was extremely healthy. I kept hearing you're so young, and you're healthy. I did doubt that I had breast cancer, I was a little angry that they were even telling me this. In my mind I did not believe it. The cancer was in my lymph nodes. I did chemo for about eight weeks, after chemo I had a lumpectomy. I did six weeks of radiation; most of the lymph nodes were remove from under my arm so after a year of radiation I devellymph nodes were remove from under my arm so after a year of radiation I developed lymphedema in my right arm. I wear compression sleeves daily to control the fluid that will build up and enlarge my arm. It's been ten years I am cancer free and I am surviving.

I push through to help my two daughters, my siblings and their daughters, my friends and their daughters. If I can tell my story ten times each day and half of the people that listen goes and get a mammogram; that's a win. We need to educate ourselves and the people we know. Early detection and self-examinations is the key. There have been so many studies and so many breakthroughs. But we are not done, the fight continues, I challenge everyone to take a friend with them to your next mammogram. That's the power of winning!
